How involved did the panel feel?

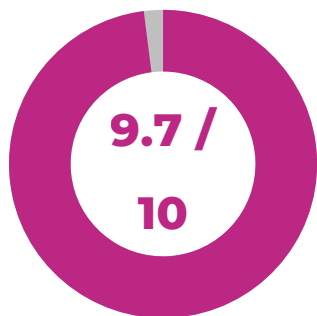




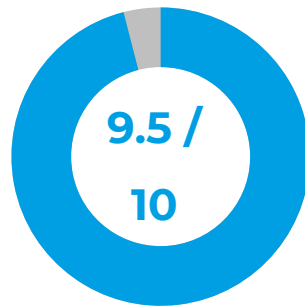

from Attendees

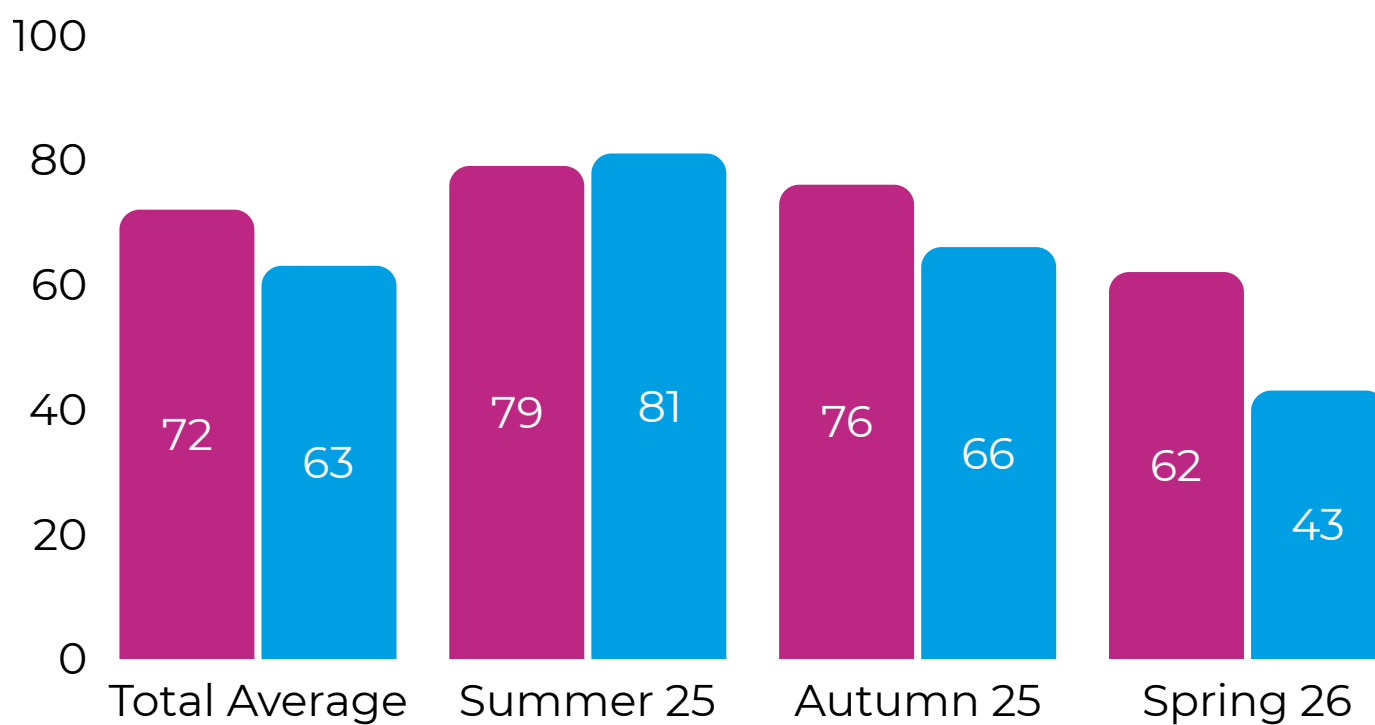


Average Usefulness Rating

And we continue to make change that matters.....

Feedback on the West Sussex Disability Register membership form helped services see how parents approach and experience the form. This highlighted what families notice first and where things feel difficult, directly informing changes to structure and wording to make the form easier to complete.

Submitters working on the Parent Impact Survey, Voice and Participation Strategy and SEND information materials, reflected that the panel helped them rethink their work from a parent carer point of view, influencing how guidance, surveys and questions were framed before being finalised.

Panel discussion with the WSCC CYPL team specifically shaped the wording of the APST letter, where professional language was replaced with clearer, more family-friendly wording. This included agreeing the phrase “Harm and worries outside the home” instead of “contextual safety”, helping make the purpose and audience of the letter clearer to families.

Feedback led to changes in documents such as The SEND Strategy, SEND information letter for parent carers and the Coproduction guide for parent carers, improving tone and making the language feel less formal and more approachable.

Feedback offered at the panel is guiding the development of the Wraparound Toolkit so it better reflects the everyday needs of children and families.
